2ND AWARDS, INDUCTION AND INTERNATIONAL PEACE SUMMIT IPSPJ GHANA

Saturday, 8th October 2022 was another great induction and inauguration of Global Peace Ambassadors of IPSPJ, Ghana. The occasion was blessed with attendance from government agencies, office of the President, office of the Minister of State, the Greater Accra Regional Police Commander, Ghana Tourist Authority, various consulates from different Embassies in Ghana, Traditional and Religious leaders International Delegates from IPSPJ Africa, and many other important dignitaries. International Parliament for Safety, Peace and Justice, Ghana (IPSPJ Ghana) was established in the year March 2020 with the appointment of Amb. Ps. Alexander Obeng Boateng as the Ghana Global Regulatory Director and inaugurated in Nov 2020 during the COVID-19 season with an induction ceremony of National and Regional Executives by the International Africa President, Cardinal Prof. Esapa Sona Joseph Dominion who travelled to Ghana with other international IPSPJ delegates from other African countries.

The Saturday ceremony was spiced with the induction and inauguration ceremony of



the nominated African Queen, HRH Queen Akosua Billy Jane. Queen Billy Jane is a Ghanaian residing both in Germany and in Ghana. She is talented in the creative arts industry as an artiste, promoter, hotelier, caterer and a business woman. She is married to a German with beautiful kids.

It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others... —1 Corinthians 13:4-5

Recognizing Love, Part 2

In today's installment on recognizing love, we're going to look at more of the outline laid out in 1 Corinthians to teach us about the kind of love that the Lord wants us to have with others. It is written that love does not envy. This is especially important for Christians. When we let envy into our hearts, it is showing God that we are not satisfied with what He has given us. Being jealous of the other person in your relationship can be very damaging, too. We are made to support one another, not to compare our possessions. The affection that draws us together should not be based on material things.

Similarly, you should not brag to the ones for whom you care. Love does not boast and it will not show pride. When we draw attention to ourselves, we are stealing glory from God. As Christians, our lives are not just ours anymore, and should be used to spread the Gospel and give credit to our Father. Being prideful places your own value above the Lord's and can foster ill feelings in your significant other.

Love does not dishonor others. Each soul on Earth has value to God, and it is not our place to discount that worth. When you are having a disagreement, you should not slander your significant other, even to friends. This is especially true if you are husband and wife. Marriage is a holy union that bonds two souls together. If you cannot depend on your spouse to honor you, who will?

Today, show love to your other half. Ask God to remove envy and pride from your heart and always remember to value and honor one another.



Amb Ps. Alexander Obeng Boateng, the Country Director who doubles as the International Africa Youth Director of IPSPJ, advised the newly inducted ambassadors to live an exemplary life so they can effectively embark on the Peace, Safety and Justice campaign. He pleaded with the Country Embassies to recognise all their ambassadors and Key Officials of IPSPJ to release visas to them in times of diplomatic assignments and summits. His submission to the government of Ghana was to support IPSPJ Ghana to acquire any needed diplomatic travelling documents and special car number plates to help in easy movement in the call of duty.



Amb. Pastor Alexander Boateng an author and a gospel minister also called Pastor AOB admonished all Ghanaians to support IPSPJ Ghana, with their finances and every effort needed to make it well established to promote safety, peace and Justice. He also requested the audience to help with Peace Ambassadorial nominations to IPSPJ Ghana.



The Superintendent of Police District Commander, Cantonments, Supt. Theophilus Jacob Essilfie who represented the Greater Accra Regional Commander was briefed on his submission by opening up the mandate of the Ghana Police and their support to Safety, Peace and Justice. He told the audience and all new ambassadors to always

think of Ghana first before taking any action. He said the Ghana Police will not hesitate to partner and support IPSPJ Ghana to achieve their objectives within the powers of the Ghana Police, hence they would be there at all times when IPSPJ calls upon them.



Cardinal Joseph Dominion, accompanied by Amb. Dr. Odii Prince Orji JP. from Nigeria (the Global Regulatory Director, IPSPJ), made it clear that the position of a global peace ambassador comes with a heavy responsibility not only to Ghana but every country that will need help. He emphasised on the achievements of IPSPJ Africa due to the activeness of the Ghana Chapter and how the organisation has helped in peace advocacy in many African Countries. The African President who is also the founder and leader of The Dominion Tabernacle Int. Church announced for the first time that the International Parliament for Safety, Peace and Justice (IPSPJ) has resolved to make Ghana the HeadQuarters for West Africa IPSPJ. He said the decision, approved by the Supreme Council of IPSPJ, has become pertinent due to the dedication and commitment of IPSPJ Ghana executives and ambassadors in achieving the set goals and objectives of IPSPJ.
